Internship placements can be in both urban and rural Alaska. 2009 will mark the 5th year of First Alaskans Institute's Summer Internship program for Alaska Native undergraduate (Juniors and Seniors) and graduate students. A core component of the 10-week program's success is "Leadership Fridays"; training sessions where interns are brought together to connect with current Alaska Native leaders and other community leaders and professionals.

**Amount:** Funding for the summer intern program is provided primarily through a grant from the Denali Commission. This paid internship is 10 weeks in length, from early June to mid-August. While schedules can be adjusted based on student academic schedules, interns are expected to complete the entire 10 week session.

**Description:** The Alaska Permanent Fund Corporation (APFC) asks firms participating in the internship program to provide interns with substantially challenging work. APFC internships are intended to provide students with the chance to learn and develop their skills and to provide participating firms with some real value from the interns. Many interns have worked on projects involving spreadsheets; internships are typically suited for students of business, finance, economics, and occasionally information technology. Firms often design the work based on the capabilities of the interns. Check the website regularly each spring term when recruitment bulletins are posted and follow the application guidelines closely. Open to all Alaska residents enrolled full time in a college either in-state or out-of-state or recently graduated or to students enrolled full time in an Alaska college. Must be at least a second semester sophomore with a minimum GPA of 2.5 and a major GPA of 3.0.
